A Special Meeting of the Albion City Council of the City of Albion, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:30 a.m. on September 28, 2022 at Albion City Hall, 420 West Market St., Albion, NE. Present were: Mayor James C. Jarecki, Council Members Jack Dailey, Jason Tisthammer, and Jon Porter. Absent was: Marcus Johnson. City staff present were: City Administrator Andrew Devine and Deputy City Clerk Sharon Ketteler. Notice of this meeting along with the agenda was simultaneously given in advance to all members of the Board. Notice of this meeting was given in advance by publication, a designated method for giving notice; a copy of proof of publication is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The meeting was recorded using an audio recording device and such recording is available for inspection at the office of the City Clerk.

Councilman Dailey made a motion to approve bill from Speed Services, second by Tisthammer. Vote: Yeas; Tisthammer, Dailey. Nays; None. Abstain; Porter. Absent; Johnson.

CONSIDER CITY TREASURER REQUEST FOR AUTHORITY TO TRANSFER \$66,000.00 4. OUT OF THE HOUSING FUND FOR PAYROLL EXPENSES THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2023

City Treasurer Devine explained that donations from Mansfield Foundation, Jim and Elaine Wolf Foundation, and Boone County Foundation Fund totaling \$105,000 were put into a sequestered fund in the bank. It is not a checking account so it will be necessary to transfer money into the General Fund to be used for payroll expenses for Economic Development and Housing Director. The total amount will not be transferred in full, but either on a monthly or quarterly basis as needed. Devine stated that Citizens Advisory Committee reviewed the request on September 13, 2022 and recommended approval. Councilman Dailey made a motion to approve City Treasurer request for authority to transfer \$66,000 out of the Housing Fund for payroll expenses through September 30, 2023; second by Porter. Vote: Yeas; Tisthammer, Porter, Dailey. Nays; None. Absent; Johnson.
